

4. Community Quilts


The details will be shared at our meeting and you will have the opportunity to join the group of your choice.

More information will be provided at the June meeting.


# Community Outreach

The biggest difference that the board sought was to reduce expenses (speaker & refreshments) and reduce the workload involved.


