

Remember to bring your clean, label-free amber medication bottles to the May meeting. They will be donated to foreign medical missions. TIA!




Sit & Sew May 16 & 17

Mini Crustless Quiche

Ingredients

- 6 eggs
- 3 Tblsp milk
- 1/2 tsp mixed herbs
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1/2 cup chopped, cooked bacon, ham or chicken
- 1 cup cheese, grated
- Optional, finely chopped hot pepper, tomato, green onions, onions, broccoli, grated carrot, corn

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Spray mini muffin tray with cooking oil

Grate the cheese, cook the bacon & dice it as well as any vegetables desired, set aside

In a medium bowl, add the eggs & milk & whisk well

Add herbs, salt & pepper & whisk

Add & combine the cheese, bacon & vegetables

Spoon into prepared muffin tray.

Bake 15-18 min until they spring back when touched.

Allow to cool in the muffin tin & carefully remove.
